Welcome to Semester 1, Academic Year 2025/2026!

Please take note of the following important announcements regarding course registration:

1. Course Registration System

Please note that Course Registration is done via Course Registration). Please take note of the various dates for each course selection round as stated at the Course Selection Round 1 starts on 21 July. Please refer to the attached email from RO for more details.

Refer to the CourseReg website https://nus.edu.sg/coursereg/index.html for the detailed information. Please look through the User guide & Videos if you need a refresher on how to use the system.

You will also need to make your <u>Academic Declaration</u> before you can access CourseReg. Students are required to complete their Academic Plan declaration at least 24 hours before participating in the CourseReg Exercise. The Academic Plan Declaration page is accessible from 14 July (9am). You may refer to the user guide <u>here</u>.

Please note that for your Academic Plan Declaration, there is <u>no necessary</u> to declare any CEG 'Specialisation' or 'Tracks' (not applicable for CEG). You will not be able to select them in CourseReg as they are not configured for your selection. It is not compulsory to declare any major/minor especially you are in your first semester & if you are unsure whether to take a 2nd major/minor. Students may declare their 2nd major/minor in subsequent semesters

Students will be tagged as 'CEG2' upon accumulating (at least) 36 MCs. With the Poly APCs and sem 1/first semester course (based on average 20 Units workload), all freshmen from Poly intake are hence tagged as 'CEG2'.

You are still tagged as CEG2 now because you (or rather, most of you from AY24 Poly) have yet to pass 76 MCs (in order to be automatically retagged as CEG3).

NOTE 1: The core courses will be pre-allocated to you only if you have *fulfilled their pre-requisites*. Please refer to the Recommended Schedule for CEG students at https://ceg.nus.edu.sg/students/studyschedule/ (look for Recommended study schedule for CEG2 Poly, AY2023/24 intake students) for the course you are recommended to take in this semester.

NOTE 3: Workload Policy for first two Bidding Rounds

For students with a GPA of **more than or equal to 2.0**, the maximum workload (preallocated & selected courses) is **strictly 23 Units for Rounds 1 and 2**. From Round 3, you will be able to see your max number of units you can take when you click on 'Select Courses' in CourseReg, which is dependent on your GPA. Please evaluate the maximum workload you can handle according to your capabilities, taking into consideration that the CEG core courses generally have a heavy workload. Do not take up to the maximum workload if you find it difficult to manage.

Please note that workload increase (if approved) will only take effect from **Round 3 onwards**. Students can only select up to 23 units (inclusive of pre-allocated courses) in Round 1 – Round 2.

Please do not submit your appeal via coursereg for overloading as it will be rejected.
