Subject: Important CourseReg Announcements for CEG4 Students - Sem 1, AY26/27

This email is intended for CEG4 students from AY23 intake.

Dear CEG4 Students

Please take note of the following important announcements regarding courses registration:

1. Course Registration via CourseReg

Course registration is done via [CourseReg@EduRec](#) ([myEduRec](#) > Academics > Course Registration).

- Refer to the [Academic Plan Declaration page](#) (and email below) and complete your academic plan declaration at least *24 hours before accessing CourseReg*.

[It is Not necessary to declare your preferred CEG concentration via 'Specialisation' or 'Tracks'; both are not applicable to CEG. Anyway, CEG students will not/should not be able to select either, as they are not configured for student's selection. For 'Specialisation', application (outside APAD) has already closed. There is No option to drop/withdraw from specialisation/Minor, until the final semester. If you are in your graduating semester, please look out for my email next week for CEG4 students intending to graduate at the end of Sem 1, AY26/27, for further instructions.]

- Do note the various dates for [each course selection round](#). Round 1 of 'Select Courses' will start on 20 Jul 2026 (Mon).

a) EG2401A Engineering Professionalism

If you have not fulfilled EG2401A, refer to [OUP Wiki page on EG2401A](#) – Year 4 students select course from Round 2 (i.e. 28 Jul) onwards and select tut/lab (for its tut) on 11 Aug. If any queries, please check with OUP/CDE UG CourseReg Enquiries cdebox28@nus.edu.sg directly.

b) Upper Year Core – CS2107/CG3201/CG3207, CG4002/Integrated Project and EE4204

- If you have not fulfilled any core course(s), select from Round 1 onwards. After you have successfully secured the course(s), where applicable, Select Tut/Lab on 11 Aug.

- CEG AY23 intake is required to complete additional 8 units of Technical Course (TC) from basket of three, consisting of CS2107, CG3201 and CG3207. *For AY26/27, CG3201 and CG3207 will also be offered in both semesters.* If you fulfilled the respective prerequisite, you may Select CG3201 and/or CG3207 from Round 1 and CS2107 from Round 2.

- CG4002 (8 units) is timetabled as Lect (instead of Lab), so that the students may be grouped randomly after the 'Select Courses' rounds. Students in L1 may be grouped with students in L2 (and vice versa).

- Students are Not allowed to co-read CG4002 while on ATAP/IA, so if you are on ATAP/IA, please do Not select this intensive (project) course. Also,

i. there is a strict limit on total enrolment. 60 places will be open for CEG AY23 intake (or prior) for Round 1. The remaining places (if applicable) will be open for AY24 intake from Round 2 onwards.

ii. [CG4002's requisites](#) have been updated. Due to system constraints, a particular course may be listed as either prereq or coreq, but not both. Notwithstanding, CG2028 and/or CG2271 may be taken as either prereqs (i.e. already passed) or coreqs.

Consequently, students who have passed CG2028 and CG2271 (and CS2113) may select CG4002 in Round 1 (AY23 intake or prior) or Round 2 (AY24 intake). Students who intend to co-read (CG2028 and/or CG2271) should secure the coreq course(s) in Round 1, then select CG4002 in Round 2.

- FYP (over two semesters) to fulfil Integrated Project via CG4001 BEng Dissertation has been pre-allocated to students who are continuing/starting FYP. Please verify via CourseReg. If otherwise, inform me. For other FYP (i.e. CP4106, EE4002D/R, CDE4301/A), please check with the respective administrator/office.

c) Other Core Courses

If you have not passed any other core courses under Common Curriculum, refer to [OUP Wiki page](#) and select course in the appropriate round.

If you have not passed any other core courses under CEG Major, Select Course from Round 1 onwards. **Do NOT delay such core any further.** If a particular course is not available, email me for further instructions.

d) General Education (GE) and Unrestricted Elective (UE)

Students who wish to read GE and/or UE must ensure that the timetables of these courses do NOT clash with the timetable (lect, tut, lab AND exam) of their cores.

Please refer to [GE webpage \(AY21 intake onwards\)](#) for more details. You can Select Course for these GE and/or UE from Round 2 or Round 3.

i. The GE requirement consists of six pillars:

- Communities and Engagement; refer to [more details on C&E pillar here](#)
- Critique and Expression (ES2631)
- Cultures and Connections (courses with prefix GEC)
- Data Literacy (GEA1000)
- Digital Literacy (CS1010)
- Singapore Studies (GESS)

ii. For UE (40 units), you are encouraged to read courses hosted by CS/ECE that are listed as Technical Electives (TEs) under the [six CEG concentrations](#). If you fulfil the respective CS/EE-coded course's pre-requisite(s), you may Select Course from Round 2 or Round 1 onwards, respectively. Note: IF any timetable clash, please give higher priority to core courses.

"...

AY2021/22 intake and after: CEG students are highly recommended to read more technical electives and use/count them towards fulfilling Unrestricted Elective (UE). To achieve depth, you should read at least 8 units of depth electives. While there is no necessity, students may opt to focus on a particular concentration. To do so, a student should read at least 16 units of technical electives from the same concentration e.g. 1B+3D or 2B+2D, of which at least 8 units should be read at NUS. Students will have to ensure that they have read the prerequisite course(s) of the depth courses. ..."

Please note that reading at least 16 units of TEs in the same concentration does NOT constitute formal requirements for '[specialisation](#)', so it will NOT be reflected in the transcript or degree scroll. Nonetheless, to encourage students to read courses listed under the six CEG concentrations, students who passed at least 16 units of TEs (with at least 8 units of Depth TEs) from the same concentration will be awarded a certificate *upon request*. Please look out for the email blast in your graduating semester (in March or Sept) and respond by the stipulated deadline.

If you are unable to secure a TE in Round 2 or 1, you may:

- a. try again in subsequent round, and/or
- b. submit appeal - Type: Unable to secure course - from 6 Aug.

Please do not email course's host department or me to appeal/request for pre-allocation of CS/EE-coded TEs; not possible. Please be flexible in your choice of TEs.

e) Workload Policy

- For students with a GPA of more than or equal to 2.0, the maximum workload (pre-allocated AND selected course) is 23 units for Rounds 1 & 2. From Round 3, you will be able to see your max number of units (which is dependent on your GPA) when you click on 'Select Courses' in CourseReg.

GPA	Max Workload (Rd 1 & Rd 2)	Max Workload (Rd 3 onwards)
4.5 – 5.0	23 units	32 units
4.0 – 4.49	23 units	28 units
3.0 – 3.99	23 units	26 units
2.0 – 2.99	23 units	24 units

Please evaluate the maximum workload you can handle according to your capabilities, taking into consideration that the CEG core courses generally have a heavy workload. Do not take up to the maximum workload if you find it difficult to manage.

- For students with a GPA of **less than** 2.0, the maximum semestral workload is 20 units for all selection rounds. This means that you cannot exceed a workload of 20 units in the semester.

- The [minimum semestral workload](#) is 18 units. CEG3/CEG4 students are generally Not required to apply for min workload waiver, unless you have secured more than 18 units THEN wish to drop below 18 units After Round 3. Please do Not underload one semester, at the expense of subsequent semester(s). My checks for workload typically start after Round 3, so do look out for my email then.

- You are advised not to overload by taking more than the recommended workload. If you have strong reasons to appeal beyond your maximum workload, please email the following information to **CEG Year 4 Coordinator Dr Boyd Anderson** boyd@nus.edu.sg & cc me cegcwn@nus.edu.sg:

- Total units you planned to take in sem 1
- Supporting reasons for exceeding maximum workload in sem 1
- Sem 1 workplan - course code, title and units for the respective courses
- Personal details - name, student ID, degree level code i.e. CEG4, current GPA, total units passed to date

Please note that even if you are approved to take extra units, you can only select course (for the 'extra' units) from Round 3 (3 Aug) onwards.

As FYP of 12 units is a two-semester course, where applicable, account for it as 6 units in your workload for sem 1, AY26/27.

2. Apply for Graduation (AFG)

If you intend to graduate at the end of Sem 1, AY26/27, please secure all remaining courses, then Apply for Graduation (AFG) via [EduRec](#) thereafter, by 14 Aug 2026. [Navigation after login: Self Service > Degree Progress/Graduation > Apply for Graduation]. Do check that you have fulfilled all requirements to graduate, using the [AFG/FFG checklist](#) (as per your intake year) revised/dated 10Jun25. For students who cannot AFG via EduRec due to whatsoever reasons, please flag to me.

3. CEG4 Briefing

A joint department briefing for all CEG4 students has been scheduled for **7 Aug (Fri), 2pm @ LT1**. Do attend the session to stay informed on CEG4 academic matters, among other information.
